During quarantine I watched a DC show called Black Lightning on Netflix. I love all of the action and I learned so many quotes that I had never heard before.

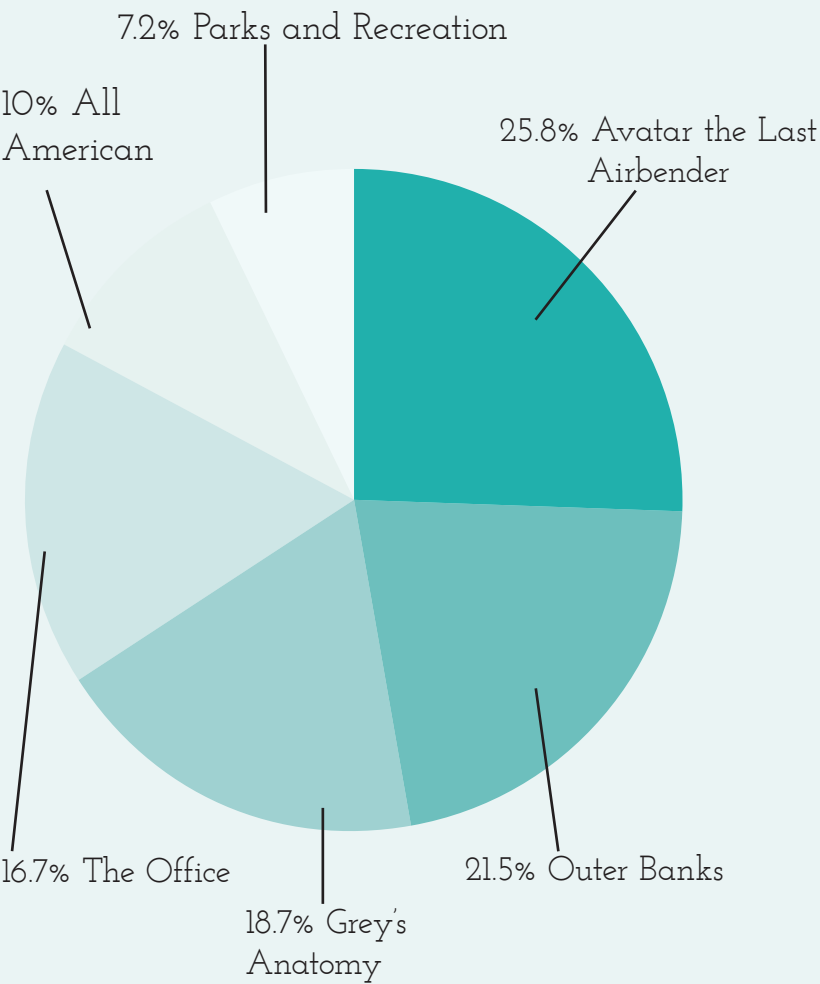

I watched a lot of Naruto and The Good Place on Netflix. My favorite part of the shows was the comedy.

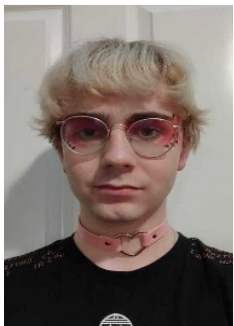

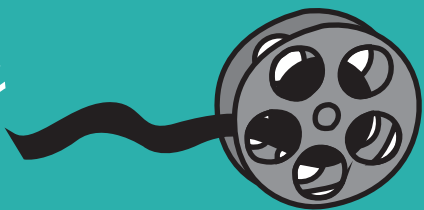

AERIAL SHOT

"It's a really high shot that like gives a top view of a landscape. You can usually do these with a drone or helicopter."

"This is where the camera is slightly tilted sideways in a diagonal which makes everything seem 'off.'"
